1.0 PURPOSE

4.0 DEFINITION OF TERMS

4.1 Definition of terms used:

For the purposes of this procedure the following terms shall apply:

Interdisciplinary session – Refers to a conference of scholars from different academic disciplines discussing the same theme.

- 4.1.1 HOD Head of Department
- 4.1.2 FAB Refers to the Faculty Academic Board

5.0 PRINCIPAL RESPONSIBILITIES

The Dean shall be responsible for the adequacy and effective implementation of this procedure.

6.0 METHOD

- 6.1. The Interdisciplinary Session has a fixed calendar of events which take place for three days between end of February and beginning of March every year.
- 6.2 The Chairperson of the Interdisciplinary Session shall invite departments to formulate a general theme and the sub titles for the following year by end of May of the academic year.
- 6.3 The theme and subtitles shall be evaluated by the Faculty members during the Annual Planning and Evaluation Session (May June).
- 6.4 The Chairperson of the Interdisciplinary Session shall prepare a Call for Papers and submit to the Dean for approval.

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- 6.5 The Dean shall forward the approved call for papers to the Publication Department for editing, design and printing of posters.
- 6.6 The Chairperson of the Interdisciplinary Session, upon receipt of the abstracts, shall convene a meeting to evaluate all of them and communicate their verdict to the authors. Authors of the abstracts accepted shall be requested to prepare and submit the full papers by the end of the second week of February.
- 6.7 The Chairperson shall prepare the event programme.
- 6.8 The interdisciplinary session shall take place as scheduled on the Programme.
- 6.9 The Interdisciplinary Session Chairperson shall request the authors to finalise their papers taking into consideration the comments and discussions held after their presentation and forward them to him/her for inclusion in the proceedings by end of March.
- 6.10 The Interdisciplinary Session Committee shall edit the papers and forward them to the CUEA Press by end of May.
- 6.11 The Publications Department shall complete the printing of the proceedings ready for publication by end of July.
- 6.12 Records of all the activities shall be maintained.
